100-years-old and going strong...

DENVER'S OLDEST STAMP CLUB

The Denver Stamp Club celebrates its 100th anniversary this year. Founded in December 1905, the club has been in continuous operation since that time. A Centennial Dinner will be held on November 21, 2005 to further celebrate the event. A special cachet as well as a display of Denver related philatelic material will be shown the night of the dinner.

The Denver Stamp Club became a member of the American Philatelic Society when the club formed and received Charter #22 from the APS. Today there are only seven remaining clubs with charters older than the Denver club. These are Chicago and St Louis 1887; Pittsburgh and San Francisco 1889; Cleveland 1890; Kansas City 1894; and Philadelphia 1904.

McKeel's Weekly Stamp News of April 20, 1907 carried a notice of the 17th regular meeting of the Denver Stamp Club. At that time the officers were, C.A. Nast, President; O.K. Carstarphen, Vice President; H.A. Davis, Secretary; and W.G. Swart, Treasurer.

The Club has met in a number of locations over the years. In 1934, the Denver Stamp Club held a monthly stamp bourse in addition to its regular meeting. One of these

bourse meetings that year was held in Judge Sackmann's Chambers in the West Side Court Building located at Colfax and Kalamath. In 1969, while seeking a new meeting location, the monthly meeting was temporarily held in Room 111 of the Denver Public Library.

In an article last year in *Scribblings*,

Jack Willard remembered his first stamp show and his friend and fellow collector, founding member of the Denver Stamp Club, H.A. 'Doc' Davis.

"The first stamp show I attended was in an empty rented storefront in the 1500 block of Welton Street in downtown Denver in 1935. The Denver Stamp Club, already 30 years old at the time, was the sponsor."

Jack and 'Doc' became friends and in 1946, representing the Denver Stamp Club and others, they went to the American Philatelic Society show in Chicago to invite the group to hold its annual meeting in Denver in 1948. As Jack tells the story, "Doc" had been Secretary of the APS for 29 years, so his request to hold a convention in his home town held a lot of weight with the APS leadership, and they agreed to come."

Metro Denver still has a very active

philatelic community with about twenty stamp clubs in addition to being the home of the Rocky Mountain Philatelic Library.

The long and rich history of philately in the area began in 1885, only about ten years after Colorado attained statehood.

The Denver Stamp Club is the direct descendant of earlier, pioneer clubs.

One of them was The Centennial State Philatelic Society, formed July 23, 1885, with 13 active members

and five corresponding members. In September 1886, it changed its name to the Denver Stamp Collector's League.

The League at that time was a very active supporter of forming a national philatelic association. This support helped lead to the formation of the American Philatelic Association (APA) at its first convention in New York, September 14, 1886.

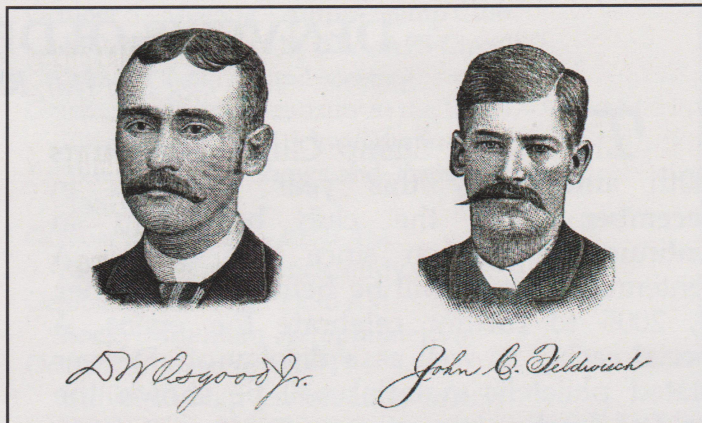
The Denver Stamp Collector's League became an early member of the APA which later became the present day American Philatelic Society.

Denver was also the home of a number of Philatelic journals, the leading one being *The Stamp*, which published its first edition in March 1886. Copies are available at the Rocky

Mountain Philatelic Library. The Denver Public Library also has copies of *The Stamp* as well as newsletters of the Denver Stamp Club.

The Club also has a large archive collection of its history.

An item from *The Stamp* of April 1886, provides an interesting contrast with today: "Stamp collecting is raging in the different public schools of this city. Every boy or girl who cannot boast of being a stamp collector is nobody just now. The small dealers are doing a thriving business and the candy shops and toy shops are deserted."

News from the RMPL ...

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

The RMPL By-Laws need a bit of updating and Board Member Steve Schweighofer presented a report incorporating changes which was accepted by the Board at its July meeting.

There are two major proposals:

1) A change in wording to make it clear that the membership as a whole elects the Officers of the library when they elect the Board.

2) Definitions of duties for the Director of Operations, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary. When the By-Laws were amended in November of 2002, the position of Director of Operations was added and the Secretary's position was broken down into two jobs. Definitions for these positions were overlooked at the time and need to be added.

The proposed changes are available for inspection at the library and comments from members are welcome. The Board will take a final vote on the amendments at its November meeting.

REVERSE PRINTING DONATION

RMPL member Jim Lays has given the library a U.S. France Overrun Country so-called "reverse printing" stamp which he discovered in his collection shortly after noticing a similar stamp brought \$1350 in a Regency Superior Auction (12/11/04, lot 595).

Jim says he also read articles in *Linn's Stamp News* about how some of the Overrun Country issues have been found with the black ink used for shading on the flags printed before other colors, so the shading is very faint. Jim says he thought, "I've got hundreds of the things. If they're all printed by the same method, why couldn't I find one too?" So he looked at his holdings and lo and behold, he found several!

Jim has since received APS Expertizing certificates for reverse printings for France (mint registration block of six), Netherlands (mint registration block of six), Poland (used single), and Yugoslavia (mint single).

He says he's been collecting for forty years and has always liked the "flags." He says

that as he ran across the Overrun Countries issues at shows and dealers shops, he purchased them and set them aside, thinking that someday he would check them for the double print name varieties listed by Scott. He says he's checked them all for the double printed names and has not found any, but the discovery of the reverse printings more than makes up for that.



A normal stamp is on top, with the reverse printing on the bottom. The blue and red colors were printed on top of the black on the reverse printing, therefore black ink on the bottom stamp is much fainter in the shading on the flag.

Jim told us he decided to make a donation of the France stamp to the library because "I already have a block of six with a certificate for my own collection, and that seems like plenty. So I thought I'd share the fun."

INTERNATIONAL JUDGES SELECTED

Congratulations to two members of the RMPL who have been selected as members of the jury for Washington 2006, the International Exhibition to be held next May. They are Bill Bauer of Unadilla, NY and Joe Foley of Riva, MD., both former presidents of the American Philatelic Society. They have been great friends and supporters of the library since opening day 12 years ago.

PRIVACY POLICY

Since the library deals with items of value and our members have similar items of value in their homes, Operations Manager Don Beuthel prepared a privacy policy for consideration of the Board of Directors which was adopted at the last meeting. Here are the high points:

1) Information on RMPL membership forms will be available to Board Members and volunteers only on a "need to know basis."

2) Use of the mailing list of members will occasionally be honored for philatelic purposes at the discretion of the President. If approved, the requesting group shall provide the completed mailing with the postage affixed. A library volunteer will then affix the address labels and put them in the mail.

3) Requests for individual addresses and phone numbers of members will not be honored. If asked, a volunteer will contact the member and give him/her the phone number of the person wishing to make contact.

4) Volunteer daily work schedules will not be shared outside of the library's usual routines.

As a general rule, security should be a consideration for all the Board members and volunteers. There have been no "incidents" or complaints relating to sloppy security in all the years the library has been in existence. It is hoped the new policy statement will help assure that our good record will continue.
