OPERATIONS MANAGER




Steve Schweighofer - RMPL Member since 1993. He is currently serving as the Operations Manager and is running unopposed.

ANNOUNCING TWO NEW RMPL VIDEO PRODUCTIONS

These are among the finest videos we (Joe Lanotte, Gary Withrow and myself) have managed to produce after a three-year hiatus due to COVID. We were unable to meet consistently, faced electrical and equipment breakdowns and welcomed a third member to our team - Gary Withrow. Once we began working on new video productions, we realized our skills and proficiency had degraded. The learning curve hindered our attempts to integrate new production features and techniques while completing these two new projects.

The Syndicato Condor Video: A presentation on the Syndicato Condor airline and related postal history of Brazil (Author: Sergio Lugo, Videographer: Gary Withrow). Servico Aereo condo The Syndicato Condor airline was a competitor to Pan American from 1927 - 1941. This is the third rendition of a presentation shown during the March 2023 American Air Mail Society ZOOM meeting. The original video was 90 minutes in length. It has been reduced to 58 minutes. The final version is available for viewing on the RMPL YouTube website and the RMPL website under "publications." The original 90-minute version is available on SYNDICATO CONDOR LEDGE the AAMS YouTube website.

The 1869 U.S. Pictorial Issue Video: A presentation by local area collector, Jerry Hager, focusing on the post-Civil War 1869 issues of the United States (Author and Narrator: Jerry Hager, Videographer: Gary Withrow). The original presentation was reduced from 65 minutes to 45 minutes. The Wyoming Stamp Club, in Cheyenne, is credited with Jerry's presentation. The video is available for viewing on the RMPL YouTube website and the RMPL website under "publications." This video is highly recommended to all, whether a beginning or advanced collector.

Covering the World



Flying Elephants Covers of India by John H. Bloor

In the 1920s airmail was still new and there were many experimental and first flights taking place around the world. One of the earliest flights in India began on December 20, 1925. Six Royal Air Force (RAF) De Haviland DH9As left their base in Risalpur. On December 24th they arrived at Dum Dum aerodrome in Calcutta after stops at Ambala, Cawnpore, and Patna. Flying time was 18 hours for the approximately 1,270-mile flight. No mail was carried on this outbound flight.

On January 2, 1926, the six aircraft left Dum Dum (Calcutta) with 125 letters (69 for Patna, 51 for Risalpur and 5 for Rawalpindi). The cover in *figure 1* is one of those addressed to Patna.

The six planes were from the RAF 27th Squadron, known as the Flying Elephants. At the request of the RAF, Stephen H. Smith designed a photographic airmail vignette/etiquette for the flight. Smith was a well-known philatelist who produced many labels, often for rocket mail flights within India. Smith usually signed these labels on the back with his name (obviously not visible on this cover). In this case, his initials also appear on the front of the label in the lower right. Two hundred etiquettes were prepared of

which 125 were used on flown covers.

It is the elephant etiquette that makes this cover interesting in addition to being an early Indian flight cover. Airmail etiquettes exist in many designs; there are thousands of them. In the catalog of worldwide airmail etiquettes, published in 1991 by Gunter Mair (available at the RMPL), there are more than 4,200 individual etiquettes of which about 700 are from the United States. Recently (2018) Mair updated the US section of the catalog. It now lists more than 4,500 individual etiquettes for the US. If you are interested in air mail and other etiquettes, consider joining the Postal Label Study Group; see their website at Postal Label Study Group (postal-label-study-group.info).

I need more covers! I have many of my own that I can use but it would be more interesting if some of our readers would send me ones that they like. Any cover could be interesting – tell me what you like about it.

What is a commemorative stamp?

Commemorative stamps are issued on a special date to honor a specific place, person, thing or event. The subject of the stamp is often identified in print on the stamp. Commemorative stamps are printed in limited quantities over a short period of time and they can be used with other types of stamps. A collector is able to learn about the geography, wildlife, important people, events and history of a country by studying the stamps they issue.

The Hidden Secrets of the One-Cent Large Bank Note Stamp (1870 - 1894)

During the 1870s the Post Office issued contracts to three different security printing companies: the National Bank Note Company, the Continental Bank Note Company, and the American Bank Note Company. With multiple companies using the same stamp dies, different security measures and different paper types, collectors are faced with a challenge. If the stamps, printed by different companies, look the same how can you tell which one you have?

In 1870 the National Bank Note Company held the contract for printing postage stamps. They produced a series of 11 stamps ranging in value from 1¢ through 90¢. Each of the stamps featured the portrait of a past President or important government official.

In 1873 the Continental Bank Note Company took over the printing contract from the National Bank Note Company due to number of complaints about the quality of the printing. Continental took possession of some of the dies and printing plates. In order to tell who printed which stamps "secret marks" were added to the printing plates and dies.

In 1877 the United States Congress directed that all printing of notes and securities be transferred to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. The Post Office continued to have postage stamps printed by private companies until 1894. The decision was a major blow to the security printing companies. In 1879, the National Bank Note Company, the Continental Bank Note Company, and the American Bank Note Company, merged under the name of The American Bank Note Company, and continued to print postage

stamps for the Post Office until 1894.

In addition to the secret marks added by the Continental Bank Note Company, the American Bank Note Company wanted to be able to tell which company printed which stamp. The company printed their stamps on a soft porous paper, reengraved some of the designs, and introduced changes to some of the colors used in the printing of the stamps.

There were a number of "special printings" made of these stamps and they are extremely rare. Many of the higher value "grilled stamps" are also extremely rare and quite valuable. When going through your stamp collection, as well as accumulations, always take the time to check for grills on the Bank Note issues.


Below are images, with the Scott catalog numbers, of the six different types of the $1 \not c$ stamp printed by the three different companies. The easiest stamps to identify are Scott #134, as it has a security "grill;" and Scott #212 as the design is different from all the other stamps.

To determine if your stamp is printed on hard, or soft paper, compare it to similar stamps. Scott #65, a very common 3¢ Washington stamp, is printed on hard paper. Scott #231, the common 2¢ Columbian stamp is printed on soft porous paper.

Scott #134 - printed by the National Bank Note Company. This issue is grilled without a secret mark.

Scott #145 - printed by the National Bank Note Company. This issue does not have a grill or secret mark.

Scott #156 - printed by the Continental Bank Note Company. This issue has a secret mark added to the ornament to the left of the number "1" and was printed on hard, white, paper.

Scott #182 - printed by the Continental Bank Note Company and the American Bank Note Company. The secret mark is found on both types of stamps. The Continental printing is on hard paper, the American printing is on soft, porous, paper.

Scott #206 - printed and reengraved by the American Bank Note Company on soft paper. An additional secret mark is found in the small frame ornament above the "US" at the top of the stamp design.

Scott #212 - printed by the American Bank Note Company. This stamp is easily identifiable as the design is different from all other 1¢ stamps.

The Queen's reign coincided with many profound letter processing developments with her stamps at the forefront.



The First Embossed Postage Stamps

Great Britain issued the world's first embossed postage stamps. The 1/- value was released on September 11, 1847. Two additional values, the 6p and 10p stamps were issued in 1848 and 1854.

These high-value stamps were printed at Somerset House and used to pay foreign postage rates. The image of Queen Victoria was created by cutting the image into the plate and impressing the paper onto the plate. This printing method was time consuming and only one stamp could be printed at a time. Images often overlapped and four margin examples are very difficult to find. Examples with two or three clear margins are affordable but may cost hundreds of dollars.

The stamps are nearly identical to the postal stationery used at the time. Most postal stationery pieces have clearly visible numbers in the design, the postage stamps do not.

The 6p stamps have a "VR" watermark in sans-serif letters that are spaced widely apart. The 10p and 1/stamps have a pair of silk threads running through them. The threads are usually 5mm apart, however many times the threads were misplaced and spacing differs from stamp to stamp.

Many of the stamps were cut to shape by those who did not know better. A collector has to be careful and avoid stamps that are re-backed and had margins added after the fact. These altered stamps are easily confused with genuine examples.







RMPL Board of Directors Meeting

Board of Directors Meeting September 21, 2023

Board Members Present: Tonny Von Loij, Jim Kilbane, Rich Palestro, Eric Carlson, Steve Schweighofer, Gary Withrow, Paul and Regina Domenici. Visitors: Alex Papp and Ken Luke Absent: Rod Haenni and Bill Douglass

Meeting called to order at 3:53 PM

Old Business

Treasurer (Bill Douglas): As Bill was absent, there was a general discussion of the financial statements for the 2022 end of year (EOY) as well as the 2023 year to date. Questions regarding 2022 EOY investment losses prompted the recommendation for the treasurer to meet with RMPL financial committee now and then at least quarterly for investment review and planning. A special Board session may be needed for final approval of 2022 financials.

2024 Special Delivery of Dreams Scholarship Committee (Gary Withrow, Regina Domenici and Rich Palestro): Report by Gary: The scholarship committee has reviewed the current 113 applicants. Hoping to generate some Colorado candidates, Gary will send information about the scholarship to local trade schools.

Follow up on the approved purchase of automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) (Regina Domenici): Since AEDs and training would cost around \$4000, the Board passed a motion to defer AED purchase and provide no cost CPR training to any of the volunteers interested. Additionally, Steve will post large signs with pertinent emergency phone numbers in both buildings.

2024 Board of Directors election (Tonny Van Loij): Three additional candidates have entered the race for board positions. Biographies and photos will be in the Nov-Dec. issue of *Scribblings*. The election is scheduled for January 2024.

Follow up on Paul Lee's "Parks, Postmarks and Postmasters" revised book publication (Jim Kilbane): Background: The option to reprint a hard-bound copy of the revised edition is cost prohibitive. Jim reported he is investigating the cost of reprinting the revised book in soft-cover format.

RMPL's 30th-anniversary open house (Paul Domenici): The anniversary celebration was enjoyed by

107 guests. This is the largest number of guests attending a Library celebration in the history of the RMPL. Congratulations to "Outstanding Volunteer Award" winners Joe Lanotte and Dasa Metzler. Thank you to all who made the party successful.

Declining membership/recruiting brainstorming (Paul Domenici): Ideas discussed:

- 1) Paul will send a trial advertisement for placement into local retirement community newsletters.
- 2) Gary will investigate putting information in youth magazines.
- 3) Eric will contact *Linn's Stamp News* and explore the value of advertising based on the ages of *Linn's* subscribers.

Budget for replacing Air Conditioning units (Steve Schweighofer): Background: The upcoming budget should include money to replace the 25-year-old AC units in 2038. Steve reports the recommendation from HVAC specialists is to replace the 2 units with 2 new units rather than one large one. Motion approved to move \$25,000 into a capital improvement fund which will make the money available when needed.

New Business

RMPL website update (Gary Withrow): Some clubs are requesting an additional page on the RMPL website to list club specific resources. The club links will be available on the RMPL website and monitored by Gary and Joe.

October live auction (Paul Domenici and Gary Withrow): Listings and bidding for the 272 lots are now available on the auction website.

Increasing the number of directors on the board (Regina Domenici): A proposal to amend the bylaws increasing the number of Board directors from 4 to 6 was discussed. Because of the close proximity of upcoming elections, the motion was not approved. In the future, the Board will discuss the idea of increasing the number of directors by staggering election years. This would preserve continuity of leadership while adding electees with new ideas.

Meeting adjourned at 5:46 PM. Next meeting is November 16, 2023.
