We have been located in our present building for over 3 years - and a busy three years it has been. Our holdings of books, periodicals, and auction catalogs have grown dramatically. Special thanks should go to philatelists from all over the world - those who have made a commitment to sharing their philatelic literature with others by donating it to the RMPL. One cannot help be impressed with the quantity and quality of these donations. It would be difficult to come up with a dollar and cents figure that would represent what it would have cost to put together a collection such as we have. When we started this venture, never in our wildest dreams did we think it would grow as it has. Thanks again to all who have made those donations.

Early on those of us who started the RMPL wondered how we would be able to handle the cost

of keeping the library operating. It was a "crap shoot" at best but nothing ventured, nothing gained. A great many people have made donations in the form of money over the life of the RMPL - money that we had hoped to receive but had no assurance that it would appear. Many of these monetary donations were for specific purposes but often it would be in the form of moving to another higher level on the membership scale. These donations were large and they were small, but no matter what the size was, they were, and continue to be greatly appreciated. We thank each and every person who has invested in the future of the RMPL. We continue to pay the bills each month and this is good.

Many said it couldn't be done. It would never work. It was crazy to attempt to start such a venture. To try to run a library such as this on an all volunteer basis — Well, it is working and we are so proud of our Volunteers. They are dependable and hard working. No task is to big or too difficult. It just gets done. With our financial status, we could never be able to afford to pay the Volunteers for the hours they devote. We greatly appreciate each and every one of them. Because of them, the RMPL is able to be open 6 days a week, six hours a day — and they said it couldn't be done. It is being done.

Speaking for the officers and board members of the RMPL, we can't thank our donors from all over the world enough - the many donors of material, cash, and time. We wish we could shake your hand and thank each of you in person. Hopefully this little note will help to indicate to you how deep our appreciation is.

Now a brief look at the future — As new books come in, they are being cataloged using the computer program, "In-Magic" and reference searches are available by computer. There is still quite a backlog of material to be catalogued in this manner, and progress is slow but sure. When, and if, we get through the packlog, we will take on the task of going back and re-working the material that is currently in the card files of our "old fashioned" card catalog. Until that can be done we will just have to work with the two systems.

Presently we are working to dispose of some of our duplicate material through several methods. We

will continue to work with philatelic youth activities and are processing the large quantities of donated stamps for children that we have at the RMPL. We will continue to sponsor the Adult Beginning Stamp Collecting classes that we have started. We will continue to host the meetings of local stamp organizations at the RMPL. We will continue to sponsor the Second Saturday at the RMPL educational programs. We will continue the publication of this newsletter - the RMPL Scribblings - and will continue to work to improve its quality. A first step in this direction is the new format (with a little color) for the new millennium with this issue. We will be working hard to help with the passage of a bill through the Colorado Legislature which will give libraries that have a 501 (c) (3) status with the IRS and are open to the public (THAT IS US), exemption from property taxes. What a help that will be. We will continue to try to build our membership numbers. We hope to work on some grant proposals that will allow us to further expand our collection.

There is still much work to be done. I don't think we will ever become stagnant. We still need your help in all ways - donation of materials, money, and time. With that continued help, the future

of the RMPL looks most promising.

## R F D ...... Really Fantastic Discovery

In a previous issue of Scribblings, I wrote about the indexing of the Railroad maps that we have on Microfilm. That project is now complete, and the index for those maps resides in the Map The next project is to complete the indexing of the Miscellaneous Maps on Microfilm. These rolls contain various maps from the They range from Department of Highways. early highway maps to an early (1913) Geologic Map of Colorado and early (1918) Road District Maps.

The cream of the crop, so far, is the discovery of a series of maps prepared by the Post Office Department. POSTAL HISTORIANS,

LISTEN UP -These maps show local areas, towns, cities, and RFD routes out of these areas. So far, the latest one that I have run across is ca. 1912. The maps show locations of the routes, post offices, discontinued post offices, and in some cases the names of the families served by the routes. For anyone interested in locating the old Rural Free Delivery Routes, these maps should prove indispensable.

Another interesting set of maps is a collection of early National Forest Maps, ca 1910. Test your National Forest trivia knowledge. Have you ever heard of the following: Holy Cross N. F., Montezuma N. F., Leadville N. F., Battlement Mesa N. F., and Sopris N. F? All of these entities were in Colorado at one time, and

your RMPL has them on microfilm.

This project is ongoing and will be for some time. The end result will be some real treasures as far as maps go.
