The State of the Library

he first of the year is a good time to take a look back at where we have been and also to look ahead at what we would like to accomplish.

When the Rocky Mountain Philatelic Library was established almost 13 years ago, it was the founder's vision to provide a place where stamp collectors could gather to share the hobby and learn from each other and where they would have an excellent philatelic literature research library available.

The vision was fulfilled almost immediately when the library opened in 1993, and it has grown and continues to grow far more than anyone imagined.

One has only to look at the activities listed on the last page of *Scribblings* or the list of philatelic literature added to the shelves to be convinced.

The founders chose the right paths to follow and the library is flourishing.

All the credit must go to librarian Ellengail Beuthel and to the group of volunteers who keep things going in apple pie order.

The passing of founder Bill Dunn in February was a huge blow. Not only was he a tireless worker, but we all

turned to him for help and advice.

Part of the vacuum Bill left has been filled by Sergio Lugo, who has taken over the Sales Department. Sergio and his group of volunteers have organized stamps and covers into easily understood categories that fill more than four bookcases. The amount of money raised through the sale of this donated material is extremely important to the library's yearly budget.

Bill's widow, Sue, and volunteer Ron Hill have taken over Sergio's job of cataloging and filing periodicals. It takes six to 12 hours a week, at a minimum, to keep up with the workload created by periodicals that are donated and those that arrive in the mail.

Another big change in 2004 was the installation of new shelves. We all owe a word of thanks to the 50 or so volunteers who, over the period of about two weeks, took all the philatelic literature off the old shelves and put it back on the new ones. It was a gigantic job, well done.

Other changes include "Bill's Garden," which Sue planted and took care of. It added a nice touch and will be gorgeous again next spring.

The library is also benefiting by the sale of Bill Dunn's stamps. Before he passed away, he and Sue set up a plan so the RMPL would receive a percentage of the proceeds from his collection. We cannot overstate how important these funds are to the financial health of the RMPL.

THE FUTURE

One small glitch is that membership is declining for the first time. While the numbers are very small, any decline is a concern.

The membership can be rejuvenated several ways.

 When your renewal notice arrives, please renew promptly.

• Bring your stamp collecting friends by for a visit and encourage them to join.

· Help spread the word the library is here and is worthy of support.

• We plan to obtain a list of collectors who live in Colorado and who joined the APS recently. We will contact them and ask them to join.

Also, we welcome your suggestions for how to attract

new members.

Another important consideration for the future is continuing expansion.

The board has hopes that the additional shelving put in last year will last for four more years. At the current rate donations of philatelic literature, that estimate may how up, but it's going to be very tight.

We need to be thinking ahead to 2008 or 2009 when we

will need additional space again.

One more thing for 2005 is acquisitions for our collection. While we have been purchasing some books, we still have funds set aside for more, so we plan to be more aggressive when it comes to acquiring more material.

If you have suggestions for materials to be acquired,

please let us know.

IN CONCLUSION...

How fortunate we are to have such a facility in Colorado! The library is alive and well, and I, for one, pinch myself every time I come through the door just to make sure it's real.
